Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund Final Reporting Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students February 3, 2021

The CARES Act (also known as the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act) is federal legislation that established and funded the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund to provide emergency funding to higher education institutions. A portion of each institution's allocation must be awarded to students in the form of emergency financial aid grants for expenses related to the disruption of campus operations due to the COVID-19 crisis.

In compliance with Section 18004(e) of CARES ACT, Pub. L. No. 116-136, 134 Stat. 281 the following is The Adrian H. Wallace Barber Academy's report describing the use of funds distributed from the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund ("HEERF").

- 1. The Adrian H. Wallace Barber Academy (The Barber Academy) signed and returned the "Certification Agreement" that the U.S. Department of Education (USDOE) required for receipt of HEERF funds allocated by section 18004(a) of the CARES Act on August 6, 2020. The Barber Academy assures that we intend to use no less than 50 percent of the funds received under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students.
- 2. The Barber Academy has received a total of \$7,170 from USDOE pursuant to our "Certification and Agreement" for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students.
- 3. \$7,170 of Emergency Financial Aid Grant funding has been distributed to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act as of December 31, 2020.

- 4. The Barber Academy has 12 students eligible to participate in programs under Section 484 in Title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965 and thus [possibly] eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act.
- 5. 12 students have received an Emergency Financial Aid Grant under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act as of December 31, 2020.
- 6. The Barber Academy determined that 12 students were eligible to receive Student Grant Funds based on the following parameters:
- The student was enrolled as an active student on October 27, 2020.
- The student was eligible to receive Title IV funding.
- The student completed a survey that was distributed to determine which students were in need
  of assistance with the USDOE suggested parameters of food, housing, course materials,
  technology, healthcare, and child-care expenses, generally all costs associated with Cost of
  Attendance.
